

**PUBLIC MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
HYATTSVILLE, MARYLAND**

February 16, 2010

Mayor Bill Gardiner called the meeting of the Council to order at 7:04 p.m. at the Municipal Building, 4310 Gallatin Street, Hyattsville, Maryland.

Present were Mayor Bill Gardiner, Council President Marc Tartaro, Council Vice President Bill Tierney, Council Members Ruth Ann Frazier, Paula Perry, Douglas Dudrow, Timothy Hunt, David Hiles and Matthew McKnight.

Also present were City Administrator Murphy, Assistant City Administrator Jones and City Clerk Barber.

Note for the Record: The City of Hyattsville has contracted with Sabra, Wang and Associates to conduct a traffic study; their findings will help the City prioritize and plan improvements on our streets. The purpose of the Public Meeting was to hear residents' concerns as they relate to traffic in the City.

Mayor Gardiner opened the meeting and provided information regarding the Traffic Study completed by Sabra, Wang and Associates.

PRESENTATION:

Mr. Paul Silberman of Sabra, Wang and Associates provided an in-depth power-point presentation that provided an overview of the traffic study, including the scope of work and identified the three project phases. Mr. Silberman highlighted the following in his presentation: existing conditions, stakeholder outreach, estimated future traffic, existing level of service, development locations, approach to developing improvements, one-way vs. two-way traffic flows, short-term recommendations, long-term recommendations, preliminary cost estimates and future improvements.

Mr. Silberman closed his presentation by discussing the next steps of the project. Mr. Silberman advised that the Council would need to comment on the recommendations before the firm can provide a final report to the City. Mr. Silberman responded to clarification questions posed by the Mayor and Council.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Ms. Nina Faye, a Ward 3 resident, discussed the proposal and provided her comments and concerns. Ms Faye advised that she would like to see traffic concerns she has identified near her home be addressed.


Mr. Seiji Hayasiti, a Ward 3 resident, inquired if and when recommendations are made if the City's vision will be taken into account.
