

**PUBLIC HEARING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
HYATTSVILLE, MARYLAND**

May 9, 2005

The purpose of this Public Hearing is to allow residents and all interested parties the opportunity to comment on requests received by the City of Hyattsville to alter the residential parking regulation at the following locations: 3500 –3700 blocks of Oliver Street; 5800 block of Maryhurst Drive; 5800 block of 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue; and 5800 block of 31<sup>st</sup> Place.

Mayor Bill Gardiner called the Public Hearing to order at 7:04 p.m. at the Municipal Building, 4310 Gallatin Street, Hyattsville, Maryland.

Present were Mayor Bill Gardiner, Council President Stuart Eisenberg, Council Vice President Paula Perry, and Council Members, Ruth Ann Frazier, Mary Elwood and Carlos Lizanne.

Also present were Chief of Police Holland, and City Clerk Barber.

Mayor Gardiner opened the Public Hearing and gave an overview of the proposed requests to alter the residential parking regulations at: 3500-3700 blocks of Oliver Street: Change time for residential parking restrictions from “Permit Required at All Time” to “from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.” (Alteration may also include changes to the days specified for parking restrictions); 5800 block of Maryhurst Drive: Remove residential parking restrictions; 5800 block of 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue: Remove residential parking restrictions; 5800 block of 31<sup>st</sup> Place: Remove residential parking restrictions.

**HEARING OF CITIZENS:**

Ms. Lucy Brogden, 5828 31<sup>st</sup> Place, addressed the Mayor and Council as the spoke person for the residents of the 5800 block of 31<sup>st</sup> Place. Ms. Brogden noted that a petition had previously been submitted regarding the residential parking on the 5800 block of 31<sup>st</sup> Place.

Ms. Barbara Anonsen, 5818 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the residential parking on the 5800 block of 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, she spoke in support of removing the residential parking from the 5800 block of 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.

Ms. Chris Calabro, 3512 Oliver Street, addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the residential parking on the 3500 block of Oliver Street, she spoke in support of the residential parking but would like to see the regulations modified for weekend parking in the area.

Mr. David Marshall, 6000 Block of 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue, addressed the Mayor and Council regarding residential parking support, but would like to see all Hyattsville vehicles get permits to help police identify what vehicle belong and those that do not.

Chief Holland summarized the current parking regulations and the requirements that need to happen after a public hearing has been held. Chief Holland noted that a preliminary report had been done and would be submitted to the Mayor and Council in the coming week.

The Public Hearing ended at 7:14 p.m.
