


<b>SUBJECT: Revisions to Chapter 114: Article V – Commercial Vehicles</b>

<b>BACKGROUND:</b> Staff recommends revising Chapter 114: Article V to be less restrictive and permit certain commercial vehicles to park on residential roadways.  On April 23, 2014, the City's Attorney met with the City's Code Committee to develop revisions to Chapter 114: Article V – Trucks and Commercial Vehicles. The revisions were incorporated into the ordinance by the City Attorney, which is attached for consideration.	
<b>NEXT STEPS:</b> Approval of the revised ordinance on August 4, 2014 and again on September 15, 2014. If approved by the City Council, this ordinance will be submitted to the Prince George's County District Council and would not be effective until it is approved by Prince George's County or the District Council.	
<b>ANTICIPATED STAFF RESOURCES REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT:</b> The City Attorney has recommended that the City also develop administrative protocol for the application of Article V, which staff believes can be developed and in place within 60 calendar days.
